Ephesians 5 : 15 - 18

Be very careful, then, how you live--not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is. Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit.

Focus Points

"Making the most of every opportunity" means using every moment given to us. -We are called to use our time not in meaningless waste, but according to God's purpose.

-We must choose to obey and live not "someday," but now. -Our daily lives—whether it's school, relationships, or work—are where we live out the most spiritual moments.

Living according to God's will in the time we've been given requires courage and commitment.

-When everyone else follows the ways of the world, we need the courage and determination to follow God's ways. -Even when we walk faithfully before God, there may be times when we don't receive what we hoped for.

-Yet, we must continue moving in the same direction as God—faithfully, to the very end.
